

Empire had given way to post-war Britain, a society rationally organized for the good of all, and run by men in heavy-framed spectacles. The welfare state had been in many ways a creation of the Church of England: several of its architects were devout Anglicans. Later, Evangelicals and New Age Christians would follow and make their mark as would successive Archbishops such as Rowan Williams and Justin Welby, contrasting characters both. Yet the closing decades of the twentieth century saw a seismic shift in the foundations of the Church of England, ultimately leading to the loss of more than half its members and much of its influence. Despite this collapse even in the twenty-first century the English still largely believe in God and most still call themselves Christians. So what went wrong, and how? This book tells the dramatic and contentious story of the disappearance of the Church of England from the centre of public life. The authors - religious correspondent Andrew Brown and academic Linda Woodhead - watched this closely, one from the inside and one from the outside. That Was the Church, That Was shows what happened and explains why.
