The relation between forests and the climate and rainfall of India is of a very peculiar nature. On the one hand, a covering of forest vegetation reduces the temperature of the air and soil, increases the relative humidity, and tends to increase precipitation, while on the other hand the exceptionally high temperature which prevails in spring and early summer over the centre of the Indian peninsula is one of the main agencies which bring about the summer monsoon rains, on which the welfare of India depends. In other words, extensive afforestation might increase the quantity of locally formed clouds and produce local precipitations, but it might also weaken the force of the south-west monsoon winds and consequently the accompanying rainfall.
