Originally published in 1973 and revised in 1985, this book is a fine companion to Lloyd's classics The Well-Tempered Garden and The Adventurous Gardener, as the master of the gardens at Great Dixter in Sussex describes the plants that are worth growing for their leaves as well as their blossoms. He explains what to look for, what to avoid, and considers the shapes, sizes, habits, textures, and colors of various foliage. He also suggests, with the aid of sketches and plans, what can be done with these plants in different positions, from the shady border to the sunny bed. 224.
